At Galliford Try we acknowledge that long-term climate change has the potential to adversely impact our environment, society and business. We recognise that energy use is inter-related with climate change and therefore, we are committed to the effective and efficient management of energy to achieve performance improvements. We deliver this commitment by:

- Ensuring compliance with all relevant legislation as a minimum and, where practical, approved codes of practice and other requirements such as those specified by our clients.
- Measuring our energy consumption, and publicly reporting our associated Greenhouse Gas Scope 1 and Scope 2 carbon dioxide equivalent emissions, on an annual basis.
