

Galliford Try recognise that the manufacture and distribution of the materials we use has the potential to cause adverse social, economic, and environmental impacts. We purchase the overwhelming majority of our materials from our Suppliers (either directly or via a sub-contractor) and are committed to selecting, supporting, and collaborating with Suppliers that are taking steps to address sustainability issues.

We deliver this commitment by:

- ◆ Considering sustainability issues in the selection of our Suppliers. Above and beyond our expectation of compliance with UK legislation, we aim to utilise suppliers that meet the following standards:
 - Certified health and safety (ISO 45001), environment (ISO 14001), quality (ISO 9001), and Responsible Sourcing (BES 6001) management systems and FSC certification for timber products.
 - Active management of environmental impacts, including energy/climate change, waste, water, biodiversity, and pollution.
 - Policies or procedures covering employee rights to work in the UK, employee rights (e.g. working hours, benefits, and training), equality/diversity, grievance/whistleblowing and payment of the real living wage.
 - A community or corporate responsibility policy or procedures.
 - Active membership of the Supply Chain Sustainability School.
 - Procedures to reduce the risk of modern slavery (including forced, compulsory and child labour) occurring in their supply chain.
 - Certified Cyber Essentials accreditation as a minimum standard.
- ◆ Actively engaging with our Suppliers to build effective relationships. As well as regular dialogue and meetings, we provide transparency of our dedicated supply chain contacts and project pipeline (including tender activity, project progress and subcontractor appointment).
- ◆ Committing to paying suppliers in line with the requirements of the Fair Payment Code and mutually agreed contract terms.
- ◆ Encourage the use of electric vehicles and plant alongside sustainably produced biodiesel and hydrogen for use in plant and equipment.
- ◆ Being Partners, board members and active participants in the Supply Chain Sustainability School, which provides free industry specific sustainability guidance and training to the construction supply chain.
- ◆ Working with our supply chain to deliver continuous improvement across a range of sustainability priorities, including health and safety and carbon reduction.
- ◆ Actively engage with local SME's and VCE's to support growth and supplier diversity to provide social value outcomes and local employment.
- ◆ Providing sufficient information, resources, and training for employees involved in the implementation of this policy.
- ◆ Communicating this policy to all potential and existing Suppliers.

Overall responsibility for responsible sourcing and this Policy rests with the Executive Board. The Divisions are responsible for ensuring the requirements of this Policy are implemented.

This Policy statement applies to all our current and potential Suppliers and is available to all employees via our intranet-based business management system. The Policy is also made publicly available on our website. The contents of this Policy will be reviewed and updated as necessary on at least an annual basis.
