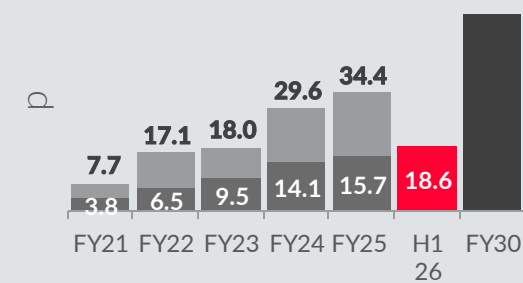

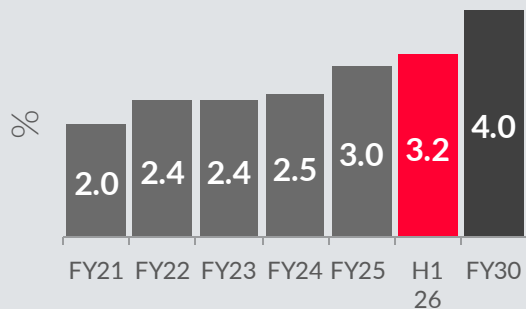

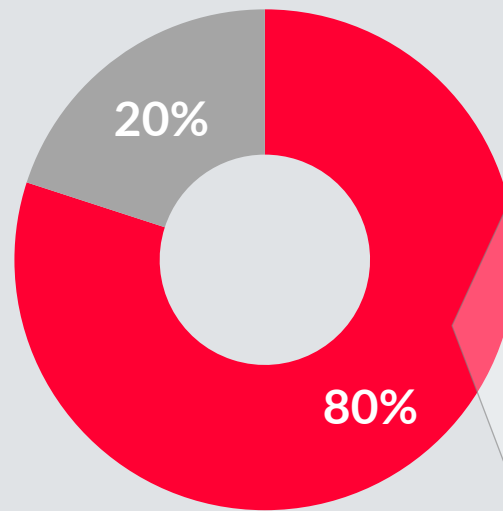

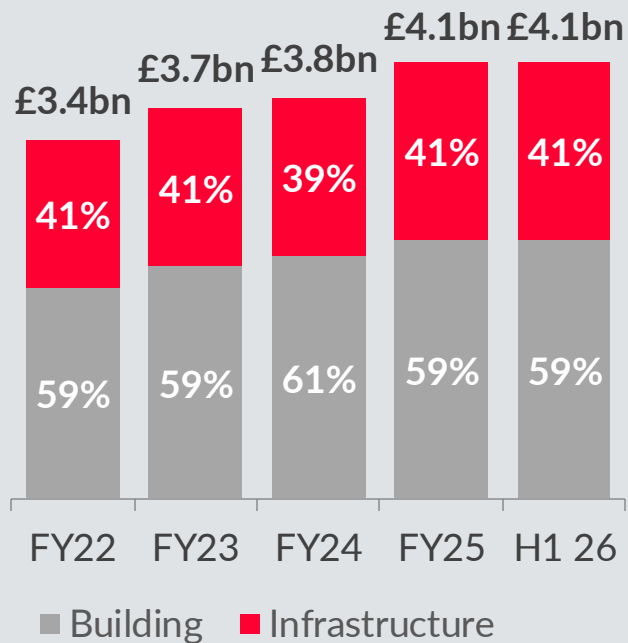

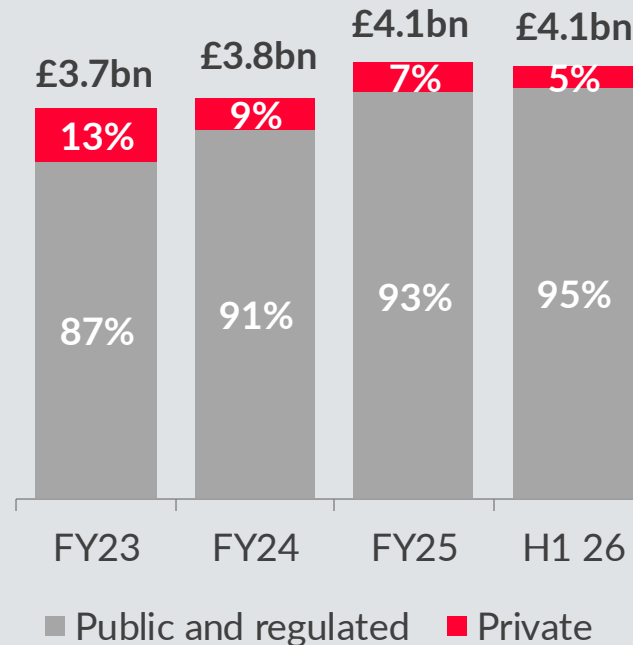

Cancer Centre

Milton Keynes University NHS Foundation Trust

Value: £10.9M | Milton Keynes

The Milton Keynes Cancer Treatment Centre for the first time brings all the cancer services provided by Milton Keynes University Hospital under one roof in a bespoke, improving service accessibility, meeting growing demand and enabling more people to receive treatment locally.

The Cancer Treatment Centre provides a 3,000m² facility with 24 dedicated oncology and hematology beds, chemotherapy consulting and therapy treatment rooms, and ambulatory services. Delivered on a busy General Hospital site amidst Covid-19 lockdown, construction of this facility was awarded 5/5 by MacMillan in September 2021.



Edenbridge Memorial Health Centre

GB Partnership – Kent Community Health NHSFT
Value: £13.5M | Kent

The EMHC delivers an integrated care model, combining primary care, community hospital, social and community services under one roof, putting health services at the heart of the community.

Designed for future growth, EMHC is built in accordance with Health Bulletin standards, with sustainable, flexible and multi-functional space. The facility can accommodate a further 20% increase in the local population and can adapt to evolving health and wellbeing needs. The 2000m² of clinical and community space includes a GP practice, outpatient services, minor injury unit, phlebotomy, therapies and social prescribing.



Finchley Memorial Hospital

Elevator Partnership

Value: £26M | London

Featured as a case study in the Department of Health's publication 'Tomorrow's Healthcare Environments, towards a sustainable future', this hospital's expansive extension was an integral part of Barnet's NHS transformation of local health services to meet future healthcare needs of the community. Services include specialist rehabilitation and intermediate care, primary care services, outpatients' services, therapies, a café and pharmacy unit.

Phase one, including construction of the 9,500m² hospital (including a new car park) ensured minimal disruption to ongoing clinical activity. Phase two demolished the existing hospital building, and landscaped the former Bow Lane playing fields, to form the Health Campus and playing pitches.



East Lothian Community Hospital

NHS Lothian

Value: £72M | Scotland

Largest facility to date delivered under the Scottish Hub Framework, the East Lothian Community Hospital meets the needs of residents by accommodating a comprehensive range of clinical services, including diagnostics, 132 inpatient beds, endoscopy, specialist outpatients and rehabilitation services closer to patient's homes.

Delivered early by adopting modern methods of construction, including offsite bedroom and mechanical/electrical elements, Galliford Try also funded part of the scheme and are now delivering the facilities management package through a 25-year contract.



Countess of Chester- ED & SDEC

Countess of Chester Hospital NHS Trust

Value: £12.5M | Chester

Galliford Try delivered two projects to improve urgent care at Countess of Chester providing a more efficient delivery model, increasing capacity, and providing a vastly improved service for patients.

The first involved remodelling the Emergency Department (ED) including main reception, dedicated pediatric reception, waiting area, central nurse base, and associated treatment space. The second project delivered a Same Day Emergency Care (SDEC) unit with 38 single bays, supporting consultation rooms and diagnostics. Working in a live environment, we delivered both schemes around the busy ED with zero RIDDORs and implementing additional Covid-19 safety measures without any impact on works or disruption to clinical services.



Croydon Emergency Department

Croydon Health Services NHS Trust

Value: £16.5M | Thornton Heath

The purpose-built Croydon Emergency Department offers a better health care environment for patients and staff. This ED delivers an Urgent Treatment Centre, 28 Majors bays within a new re-planned Majors area hub to coordinate services and patients, a new main entrance and building facade. This facility was completely re-planned within retained estate and extended by approximately 20% to create an ED which is bright and modern.

This 2000m² refurb and 1000m² new build scheme was delivered adjacent to the busy live ED without disrupting clinical services. This project also achieved BREEAM Very Good for refurbishment works and BREEAM Excellent for the new build elements.



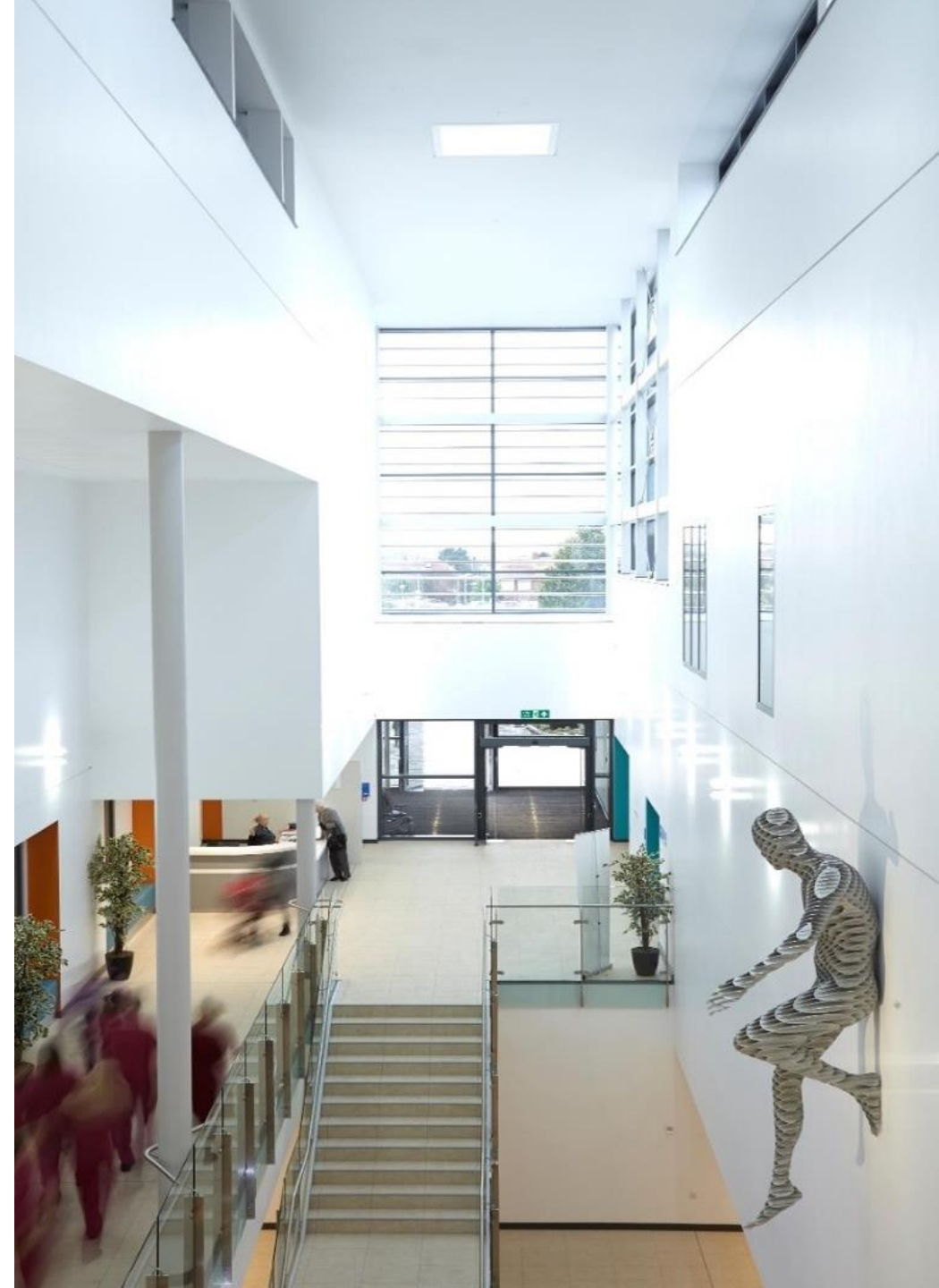
Queen Elizabeth Emergency Department

Gateshead Health NHS Foundation Trust

Value: £28M | Birmingham

The re-developed EDC has increased capacity, addressed admission avoidance, improved patient flows and discharge planning, improved clinical efficiencies, patient pathways and operational savings, alongside a 21st century emergency care centre.

Designed based on an American service delivery concept, this building provides adult medical, surgical and paediatric assessment and medical and surgical short stay alongside an emergency care and walk in centre. In addition to being designed to be energy efficient, this scheme was hailed as an exemplar design and features in HBN 15-01. The Emergency Care Centre (ECC) was a finalist in Excellence in Accident and Emergency (A&E) Award 2016.



Queen Elizabeth – Pathology Centre

Gateshead Health NHS Foundation Trust

Value: £9M | Gateshead

Galliford Try transformed a 1970s laundry building into a state-of-the-art, open planned, automated laboratory overlooked by a mezzanine level, housing management and administration facilities.

This building has brought together general pathology services from three trusts into a single facility comprising of an automated lab, histology and cytology labs, containment level 3 rooms, polymerase chain reactions labs, admin and management suite and staff support areas. Project Benefits included 15% staff savings and 12.6% savings in overall operating costs.



Maple Centre

Milton Keynes University Hospital

Value: £14M | Milton Keynes

The new Maple Centre offers same day emergency care to reduce A&E pressure. Since opening, it has improved efficiency through rapid diagnosis, treatment, and discharge, cutting waiting times and reducing ED attendances by an average of 300 patients per month.

The Maple Unit is Galliford Try's fifth scheme delivered under the ProCure22 Framework for Milton Keynes University Hospital as part of the Trusts long-term estate strategy. The 2900m² unit is located immediately adjacent to the existing A&E department, providing integrated access to primary care, community and social care for patients with complex or multiple needs who attend A&E.



Angio Building, Milton Keynes Hospital

Milton Keynes University NHS Hospital Trust
Value: £3.4M | Milton Keynes

Complex refurbishment of an existing medical building to create new office accommodation for the hospital's Cardiac Angiography Department and increased the size of their IT hub.

This refurbishment was undertaken two floors above life-saving heart surgery theatres, which remained in full operation throughout. The construction activities included the refurbishment and fit out of two empty floors of the building, installation of new partition walls, flooring, windows and furniture and fittings, as well as upgrade of M&E plant and insulated render to the facade.



Blackpool Ambulance Hub

North West Ambulance Service

Value: £6.5M | Blackpool

Galliford Try delivered this state-of-the-art, three-storey ambulance hub designed to improve emergency response times through rapid refuelling and restocking in a double-height make-ready bay.

The hub features a low carbon design achieved through measures such as airtight envelope construction, the orientation of the building to maximise solar gains, and the eradication of thermal bridging. Low carbon technology included air source heat pumps, heat recovery units and LED lighting with smart lighting controls, reducing running costs for the client.

On-site generation of energy offsets most residual carbon required to run the building by utilising renewable energy technologies and reduces actual running costs of the station.



Endoscopy Decontamination Unit - Glenfield Hospital

University Hospital of Leicester NHS Foundation
Trust | Value: £6.5M | Leicester

This new build, state-of-the-art Endoscopy Decontamination Unit at Glenfield Hospital, provides essential diagnostic facilities over two floors, improving existing services by centralising disparate decontamination facilities into a single location. The new unit has increased capacity to ensure faster diagnostics and faster treatment referral for routine patients, as well as suspected cancer and clinically urgent patients.

Galliford Try won the ProCon Leicestershire Award in the Medium Non-Residential Scheme of the Year category in 2023 for this scheme.



Ward 20 Glenfield Hospital

University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust

Value: £3M | Leicester

Galliford Try resolved the hospital's time critical requirements for additional space to accommodate winter admissions by designing and building a temporary ward facility at Glenfield Hospital using Modern Methods of Construction.

Ward 20A modular extension is a 28-bed general admission inpatient ward within the hospital (part of University Hospitals of Leicester NHS Trust's estate). The project delivered a modular extension of 34 units, providing sufficient beds until the Trust's long-term redevelopment plans are implemented. The ward layout ensures compliant inpatient and support spaces, enabling efficient supervision and high-quality clinical care.



Evelina Children's Hospital Sky Ward

Guy's and St Thomas' NHS Foundation Trust
Value: £10.8M | London

The delivery of the Sky Ward allows Evelina Children's Hospital to expand their clinical operation onto the sixth floor by converting an entire admin floor into a complex ICU, including a 10-bed Critical Care Unit, a six-bed bay and four single rooms plus 18 cardiac beds.

Delivered on the tightly constrained city centre site, we refurbished both the first and sixth floor of the building into complex clinical spaces while the rest of the hospital maintained full clinical operations. Refurbishment of the first floor included an Imaging Centre, MRI/IR lab with supporting recovery suites as well as ultrasound and four consulting rooms.



Southend Hospital

Southend University Hospital NHS Foundation Trust | Value: £6.5M | Southend-on-Sea

Tackled covid-19 by delivering a fast-track 52-bed modular facility as part of the UK Government programme of A&E upgrades using modern methods of construction. We delivered this facility adjacent to the live Southend Hospital A&E department without disruption to clinical services, which now treats up to 100 patients a day, providing ward accommodation and supporting services set over three floors.

The scheme provides a one-stop-shop designed specifically for same-day emergency care, offering testing, x-rays, ultrasound, and drug administration to relieve pressure on other areas of the hospital.



Royal Derby Hospital – Hybrid Theatre

University Hospitals of Derby & Burton NHS

As part of a programme of work, Galliford Try delivered the Hybrid Theatre within Royal Derby Hospital, providing a service that allows people with life threatening conditions to be treated in a single session.

The single-storey modular extension, built above the Orthopaedic Outpatients entrance and adjacent to eight live theatres, houses the advanced Philips Auzorian Flexmove system for procedures such as cardiac ablations and pacemaker insertions.

The 345m² 4.3m high flat-roofed modular structure also houses a scrub room, control room, storage room, offices and staff space. Our Building East Midlands team claimed the coveted Integration and Collaborative Working Award at the Constructing Excellence East Midlands Awards 2023.



Queen Mary's Hospital

Oxleas NHS Foundation Trust

Major re-development of the Queen Mary's Hospital, which was facing closure due to poor performance, delivered by Galliford Try involving £30m of complex, phased refurbishment to help transform the Hospital into a modern elective care centre. Over five phases we have delivered a kidney treatment centre, urgent care centre, GP out-of-hours service, and the phased refurbishment of six live operating theatres. This project showcased our skills from master planning through to soft landings and aftercare, transforming the site into a patient-facing community facility, bringing vital care out of central London and closer to home.

The new CAMHS facility, is the largest in Europe, to provide specialist bespoke care for young people with mental illness, autism and learning difficulties. It now provides care for 110 young people, each with individual ensuite bedrooms and access to sports and therapy areas, family space and landscaped courtyards.

Incorporating the latest innovations from both a design and therapy perspective, we managed the design to ensure sensitive consideration of young service users' needs, particularly safety and security, which was critical as there are 11 individual wards, each requiring different levels of security.

This BREEAM Excellent building provides a supporting and welcoming environment, which houses the Charity's previously disparate adolescent services under one roof.



St Peters Hospital – Silverwood

Transforming the inpatient mental healthcare journey, Galliford Try has delivered a new build state-of-the-art inpatient mental health facility, Silverwood, within the grounds of St Peters Hospital, Chertsey, replacing the Abraham Cowley Unit, which was no longer fit for purpose.

Designed to modern standards of care and quality, Silverwood incorporates advanced technologies and construction techniques to enhance quality of care for inpatient mental health services, focusing on respectful, healing, safe and therapeutic spaces. The new unit provides 64 en-suite bedrooms, communal areas, assisted bathrooms, support spaces, and landscaped therapeutic gardens. Works included demolition of existing buildings to make way for this purpose-built facility, enhancing quality of care for mental health services.

Galliford Try has created a healing space at Alder Hey, supporting the client's vision to create Europe's first dedicated children's healthcare campus in a park. Together, they enable integrated mental health care for better outcomes. Features like a virtual ocean, giant xylophone, US-style diner, therapeutic gardens, and light-filled courtyards create a calming, child-friendly environment.



Stonebow Unit

Galliford Try has recently completed a phased refurbishment and extension of the Stonebow Unit as part of the National Dormitory Eradication programme for Mental Health facilities. We adapted the original phasing, which saw all patients moving twice into a simplified process requiring just one move per ward, limiting disruption for vulnerable patients.

The building has been designed to optimise the available funding, enhancing the therapy wards and garden spaces with new landscaping to existing courtyards and gardens areas, improving the patient and staff experience and reducing patient stays. The refurbishment provides 39 single en-suite bedrooms on the ground floor, with the facility to flex rooms between wards based on demand.



Community Diagnostic Centre

Galliford Try delivered an award-winning facility that provides a dedicated and co-located department for MRI, CT, ultrasound, general X-ray, breast screening, phlebotomy, Point of Care Testing, echocardiography, spirometry and lung function tests.

A large reception area houses check-in kiosks to facilitate efficient patient access and enhance patient experience, while new diagnostic equipment and a 40% capacity increase will enable the Trust to deliver more than 200,000 life-saving tests each year. Our Collaboration on this project and our 'one team' ethos adopted with the Trust, won the Constructing Excellence East Midlands Award for Best Retrofit in 2025.



Birmingham Dental Hospital & School of Dentistry

Prime (developer), BaSLIFT (Birmingham & Solihull LIFT) | Value: £34M | Birmingham

Fully designed using BIM to BREEAM Excellent, with thermal mass exposed concrete, night-time cooling and large opening windows, Galliford Try constructed this four-storey 15,000m² facility that is split into two wings.

Connected by an atrium, the first wing offers public access to dental services while the second wing provides bespoke research facilities including a modern learning environment for more than 600 school of dentistry students.

Innovations included design of the dental bays (layout and placement) ventilation (making use of building's concrete thermal mass) and windows (making the most of natural light). This offered significant savings on the build through cost modelling and value engineering, including a £1m saving on the building's cladding system alone.
